

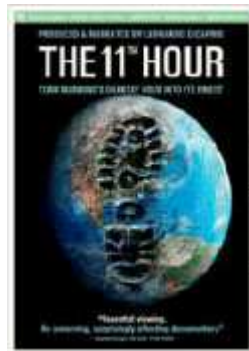

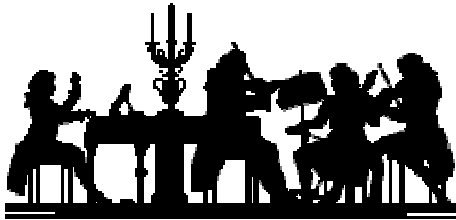
This is a free public screening of "The 11th Hour" (Rated PG). Reservations are NOT required. The theater holds 300. Seating will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

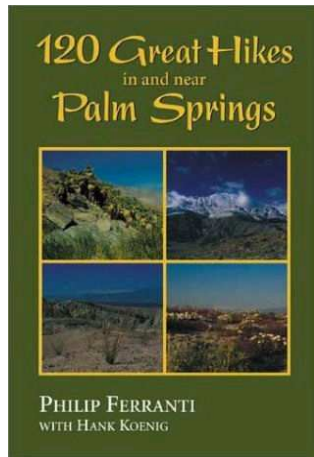
