PALM DESERT, Calif. Dr. Glen Grayman, Executive-In-Residence at Cal State San Bernardino's Palm Desert Campus, has received the Sigma Theta Tau "Friend of Nursing" Award. This award was given by the Rho Beta Chapter for his work with the Health Assessment Resource Center (HARC) and his contributions to the establishment and development of the nursing programs at the Palm Desert Campus of CSUSB.

This is only the second time in the history of the CSUSB Chapter that such an award has been given. The decision to grant this award was unanimous when the Board of Directors of the Chapter heard of the work he has done in the Coachella Valley for healthcare, professional nursing, and nursing education.

Dr. Grayman accepted his award at the annual Induction Ceremony and Luncheon held on Saturday, April 19th, at the Castaway Restaurant in San Bernardino.

Sigma Theta Tau International is the only honor society for nursing in the world. Membership is by invitation only to baccalaureate and graduate nursing students who demonstrate excellence in scholarship, and to nurse leaders exhibiting exceptional achievements in nursing. More than 405,000 members have been inducted worldwide, and members reside in more than 114 countries. With an active membership of over 130,000, Sigma Theta Tau is the second largest nursing organization of any kind in the United States.

The mission of the Honor Society of Nursing is to support the learning, knowledge and professional development of nurses committed to making a difference in health worldwide. Its vision is to create a global community of nurses who lead in using knowledge, scholarship, service and learning to improve the health of the world's people.
