CAL STATE'S OSHER INSTITUTE OFFERS FOREIGN AID COURSE

PALM DESERT, Calif. (June 8, 2009) – The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute, a program of California State University's College of Extended Learning, will offer an international affairs course this summer on how foreign aid is used as a strategy for policymakers. The class, titled **Foreign Aid and Humanitarian Crises**, will be taught by Stephen Ackerman, a visiting international relations instructor from Boise State University. The class, by referencing historical examples and case studies, will explore how the US's aid system functions in complex political environments.

Registrations are currently being accepted for the Osher Institute summer quarter, which starts June 15th.

The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute is a program designed for adults who want to experience learning for the fun of it. Courses are offered for no credit and there are no grades, no tests and no homework for the students. The Institute offers quarterly memberships for \$125 and courses typically cover subject areas in Arts and Humanities, Natural Sciences and Social Sciences. Summer courses are held at Cal State San Bernardino's Palm Desert Campus.
